

Summary of Professional Accomplishments

Rev. dr hab. Krzysztof Mikołajczuk, J.C.D., University Professor

In 1984, he joined the Higher Theological Seminary in Lublin and began studies at the Faculty of Theology, at the Catholic University of Lublin. In 1990, he obtained a Master's degree in theology. On 2 June 1990, he was ordained as a priest by Archbishop Bolesław Pylak and started working as a parish priest in St. Joseph's parish church in Kraśnik. After two years, in 1992, he was appointed as a parish priest in St. Andrzej Bobola parish church in Lublin. In the same year, he started studies in canon law at KUL. In 1995, he obtained the professional title of a Master of Canon Law and a Church Bachelor's degree. Since 2004, he has served as Honorary Canon of the Splendid Metropolitan Cathedral Chapter in Lublin.

In the diocese, he has served/served as:

- a correspondent of the Catholic Information Agency in Warsaw;
- a notary of the Metropolitan Curia in Lublin;
- an archdiocese inspector;
- a defender of the marital bond at the Metropolitan Court in Lublin;
- a vice-Chancellor of the Metropolitan Curia in Lublin;
- a judge at the Metropolitan Court in Lublin (up to now).

Other functions (not in the diocese):

- Head of the Secretariat of the Polish Bishops' Conference in Warsaw (2004-2010).

On 1 October 1996, he was employed as an assistant at the Department of History of Canon Law at the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration of the Catholic University of Lublin. In 2004, he obtained a PhD in canon law based on the thesis: *Realizing the Unity of Sacraments of Christian Initiation in Catholic Church Legislation*, written under the supervision of Rev. Prof. Marian Stasiak. On 1 October 2005, he was employed as an assistant professor at the Department of Law of the Eastern Catholic Churches. On 9 December 2014, he was awarded the degree of *doktor*

habilitowany (in the area of social sciences, in the field of law, academic discipline - canon law), by the Council of the Faculty of Law, Canon Law and Administration of KUL. The degree was awarded on the basis of the monograph entitled *Prerogatives of Cardinal Stefan Wyszyński over the Greek Catholic Church in Archival Documents of the Primate and Polish Bishops' Conference*.

In 2007, he was awarded the *Bronze Cross of Merit* for exceptional work and service by Prof. Lech Kaczyński, President of the Republic of Poland. In 2017, he was awarded the *Silver Medal for Long Service* by Andrzej Duda, President of the Republic of Poland.
